RABBI'S MESSAGE

One of the running conversations of this summer has been how early the High Holy Days are this year. In many of my recent encounters, soon after the catch up about time on the Cape or kids at Camp, vacations in New Hampshire or in a much-more-quiet Needham, have we spoken about Rosh Hashanah's early arrival. Those who most firmly embrace precision will quickly remind us that the Holy Days arrive at the same time every year: the first day of the Hebrew month of Tishre. But we who live our lives in several temporal currents – secular and sacred – academic and professional - can feel the difference.

I, for one, happen to love this time of year – no matter when it falls in relation to fall. In our temple community, we experience a warm 'homecoming' as we reunite after the separation of summer. The apples, honey, the image of the Book of Life, the shofar's sound – inspire all of the senses and are rich with meaning. In the Jewish calendar, there is nothing else like Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Where all other holidays are tied to a sacred story or to a historical event, the Holy Days are tied to an idea: that we can change and grow. No matter the past, as we enter a new year, we have the ability to create a new beginning. No matter the difficulty and the hurt, healing is possible. Things can be better. We can be better.

To help us, the High Holy Days offers us sources of strength – the sweetness, the warmth, the ancient and contemporary wisdom, the community, and, despite

our all-too-busy, all-too-fast-paced world, the precious opportunity for reflection. In one Hasidic story, on the day before Rosh Hashanah, a Rebbe sees a man rushing down the street towards the synagogue. The Rebbe asks him, "Where are you running to?" The man answers, "I am the leader of prayer in my community and I have so much to do to prepare the service!" The Rebbe responds: "My son, the service is the same as it was last year. Better you should take the time to prepare your soul – to prepare yourself."

May these days of holiness inspire us to make the most of this season of renewal. May we find strength as we make decisions to bring into greater alignment who we are and who we aspire to be. And may we seek to do all that we can to ensure that the coming year is sweet for all those that we love.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

I hope that you enjoyed the summer and the long days and slower pace that it sometimes brings. Our temple year officially started on July 1 and our Board began planning for the year with a half-day retreat in June, followed by Board meetings in July and August. We used this time, in part, to assess the progress that we had made during the preceding 12 months relative to the goals that we set a year earlier and to prioritize what we want to accomplish over the course of the next year. Drawing upon input from the congregation's Leadership Council (comprised of committee chairs, arms presidents, officers, past presidents, professional staff and Board members) and advice from our professional staff, the Board again adopted goals for 2013-14.

These goals represent the Board's assessment of the highest priorities for the congregation. They do not represent everything that is important to us, nor everything upon which we will be focusing our attention in the months ahead. It is my hope that we will make substantial progress towards these goals this year so that other deserving objectives can receive prioritized attention next year. Many of the adopted goals build from those about which I wrote in the *Scroll* in September 2012. I would like to share them with you, and invite any questions or suggestions you may have.

Goal #1: Finalize the congregation's strategy for meeting its future building needs and commence the process to secure the funding. We have made tremendous progress since last year, soliciting congregant input through parlor meetings, assessing building options and developing a recommendation, and undertaking a feasibility assessment to gauge our financial ability to move forward. This year, we anticipate completing the financial assessment and making a final decision on how best to move ahead with our Mikdash initiative!

Goal #2: Strengthen our relationships with congregants through outreach, conversation and connection. The essence of Temple Beth Shalom is community. It is the relationships that we create and build with one another. I believe that if our community is to continue to grow stronger, it will be because we are building stronger connections with one another. Our Member Relations Committee will be introducing an array of new strategies for fostering meaningful connections over this year.

Goal #3: Refine Mayim based on first year experience. Last year we implemented a ground-breaking new approach to elementary learning. It enjoyed many successes of which we are proud. As with any complex new endeavor, we were able to identify some opportunities for refinement.

We will be making those adjustments this year under the leadership of our new Director of Elementary Learning, Rachel Happel.



Goal #4: Research and develop a strategic plan for making Social Justice a component of congregational life. We are retaining this goal from 2012-13 because we still have opportunity to make progress in this area and because it speaks to part of our congregational vision statement and to a Strategic Plan priority.

Goal #5: Implement the Board's plan to ensure the congregation's ability to cover its operational costs during FY14 and FY15. Last year the Board focused its attention on developing balanced budgets for the following two years while seeking to limit increases in dues and tuition. While it was successful in doing so, the focus this year will be on ensuring that the strategies we developed are effectively implemented.

Goal #6: Conduct a comprehensive assessment of the member commitment and tuition schedules. It has been at least several years since TBS undertook a comprehensive assessment of our strategy for defining member commitment (dues) levels and tuition. We'll take time this year to perform just that assessment.

Goal #7: Implement strategies to foster an environment for healthy work and healthy living for TBS personnel. Our most treasured resources are the clergy, educators and other professionals who serve our community. Accordingly, we want to create an environment that is supportive of both excellent work and healthy, balanced lives. We'll work in partnership to determine how we can best achieve that goal.

I believe that this list of seven goals represents appropriate priorities. They have been thoughtfully considered and discussed. Our success in collectively achieving the goals will strengthen our congregation and allow us to take additional steps towards who we aspire to be – as individuals and as a community.

Before I close, let me note that while it is part of our TBS culture to always be identifying where we want to improve next, there is so very much that is already truly wonderful about Temple Beth Shalom. We have a congregation that is blessed in so many ways. For those who feel connection with and within our community, there are deep experiences of meaning, peace, joy, and love. OUR MIKDASH JOURNEY

DESIGN CONCEPT

Over the past 15 months, many of us have already come together as a community in conversation about - and commitment to - the creation of our *Mikdash* – our sacred space at Beth Shalom. Following a thorough assessment of our needs done in partnership with our architects Finegold, Alexander and Associates, we considered the deficits in our current space, our Mission, and the design possibilities to our worship, learning, celebration and professional engagement space needs.

PARLOR MEETINGS

From summer 2012 through spring 2013 we gathered at parlor meetings. Many congregants opened their homes as extensions of our temple home, while others gathered here at TBS to share information about our *Mikdash* project. Throughout this period the design concept underwent many revisions, based on expert counsel of attorneys and real estate professionals, site considerations, anticipated costs, and of course our congregants' ongoing discussion and feedback.

FEASIBILITY

In May, 2013, we moved into a feasibility phase to assess our community's ability to financially support this project. During this still-ongoing process, members of our lay-led Feasibility Team will ultimately meet with over 100 families to discuss our "*Mikdash Building Design Vision*." We believe that this vision, housed on the site of our current historic location, meets our community's needs – doubling our current square footage and providing exciting new spaces and building feature for Temple Beth Shalom in the 21st century. The feedback from those participating has been very enthusiastic.

MID-SUMMER GLEANINGS

As of August 1, the feasibility team met with 70 families. (These families represent less than 10% of the congregation, with the majority in our congregation remaining to participate in our campaign outreach.) The results of those meetings are as follows:

35 families responded to our feasibility requests offering projected giving ranges totaling between \$600,000 and \$750,000

24 of our families, moved by the design vision and the inclusive process we have undertaken, generously made financial donations totaling \$4.4 million.

As well, families over 65 are now considering legacy gifts,

and thus far we have raised \$1.25 million in legacy giving which will be used to meet future Temple needs.

This is extremely exciting as we have not yet formally begun our community campaign.

TIMELINE

We'll continue with our feasibility conversations into the fall, synthesizing feedback and information on our projected communal support of *Mikdash*. Simultaneously, consultation with our architects, legal and real estate advisors will help to finalize our design.

HIGH HOLY DAY BLESSINGS

At this pivotal time in our community, and at this time of *shuvah* (returning and reflecting,) we are all called to consider our connections - and our potential connections - with our TBS community. We each have a home here, and we each have a role to play in building the best TBS community we can.

- We have the security that in a time of hardship, loss, or joy, there is a sacred community that stands by us.
- We have the blessings of a home in which to hold rituals and mark milestones, and beloved clergy and professionals to guide us along these paths.
- We have the privilege of listening ears – of fellow congregants and caring spiritual leaders – when we come with large life questions about how the world works, how to make sense of tragedy, how to affect large social change.
- We have the gift of an inspirational, entrepreneurial, creative, and engaging culture.
- We have the privilege of knowing that we are a part of something bigger than ourselves – of a community that is greater than the sum of its parts.

As we prepare to look back at the transformational year behind us, and consider our inscription in the Book of Life for the year to come, may we embrace a call to build our *Mikdash* so that in it, we can dwell, thrive, grow and live in what is holy.

What is BESTY?

BESTY (BEth Shalom Temple Youth), our Senior Youth Group is open to all temple members grades 8-12, and is a program run largely by teens, for teens. The goal of BESTY is to make Judaism accessible to all, whether that is through direct learning, spending time with Jewish friends, or anywhere in between. BESTY hosts events once or twice a month, including lounge nights, ski trips, Fire and Ice, and more. BESTY is affiliated with NFTY-NE, the youth division of the URJ. NFTY-NE is one of 16 national regions in NFTY (North American Federation of Temple Youth), and is comprised of youth groups from Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Vermont, Maine, and parts of New York. On top of local youth group events, BESTY takes part in region-wide events with teens throughout the area. The BESTY Board creates each event for the BESTY community on top of developing important leadership skills throughout the year. This year's board was selected by a group of outgoing board members and their leadership. Each person applied to the board, and was carefully and thoughtfully placed into a position that was thought to be best suited for his or her skill set.

Fall Green Tip From Shomrei Adamah 120-degrees Fahrenheit

Many water heaters default to 140-degrees Fahrenheit (60 degrees Celsius) when they ship from the manufacturer, but temperatures that high pose not only high energy costs but scalding risks to your family. Most water heaters operate just as efficiently at 120-degrees Fahrenheit (49 degrees Celsius), and the lower temperature could help increase the lifespan of the heater.

For every 10 degrees you lower the water temperature, you can save between 3 and 5 percent in utility costs. Additionally, wrapping an insulating blanket around your water heater will help save energy this winter, possibly as much as 4 to 9 percent in water heating costs. 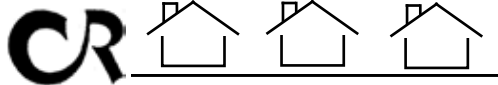

The Communications Committee proudly invites you to join the Temple Beth Shalom Community Bulletin Board (TBS-CBB).

This new service lets you exchange emails with other Temple members about things that may benefit any or all of us.

Sounds awesome! How does it work?

For this to work for you, you sign up for the bulletin board. Then when someone has something to post, you will receive their email. You can reply, save, or delete, as appropriate.

When you have something to send, you email the given address, and all those who signed up will receive your email.

So how do I sign up?

Simply email communitylist@tbsneedham.org. You will receive an email back confirming that you are signed up for the bulletin board and telling you the address to use to send TBS-CBB emails.

Please note that you will be able to receive and send TBS-CBB emails only via the address you use to sign up (not from a different email address you may use at work).

Wait – Won't my inbox get flooded?

Other synagogues and groups love this system and do not find that to be an issue. Here's why:

- The email comes from the person who sent it, so replies can go directly back to that person, not to everyone.
- We will monitor the emails so that we can create a separate group should the need arise. For example, if many people starting posting about suggestions of books to read, we could create a separate group of those interested in book ideas.
- There are a few simple rules (below).
- There's usually a bigger influx at the beginning, but then it slows down.
- You can always unsubscribe.

What are the rules?

To keep the system useful and efficient, we ask the following:

- Send your listing only once. (Yes, if there is a major change in what you sent, please do send a follow-up email.)
- Hit reply, not reply all, to respond to TBS-CBB emails.
- This is meant to let people find about things they may not otherwise know. **As such, it is not a replacement for placing an ad for your business or service.**
- Kindly remember that this is a friendly tool for practical stuff—it is not a discussion forum, soap box, complaint corner, etc. Issues related to the Temple should be brought to the attention of Daniel Barkowitz at dbarkowitz@tbsneedham.org.
